All others may be used as secondary or unit instructors at DEMA's discretion. Biography should include a "Statement of Currency" detailing how your responsibilities provide you with the opportunity to remain current in Recovery and/or Mitigation programs.*

Recommendation from your employer, vouching for your participation in any listed incidents, as well as your overall experience with Recovery and/or Mitigation programs.

Certificates of Completion for any of the following programs you wish to be considered to teach:

G-205 – Recovery from Disaster: Local Government Role

G-358 – Evacuation and Re-Entry Planning

G-361 – Flood Fight Operations
